**Background:** OSHA has been citing violations resulting from employee

exposure to chromic acid, mist, or dust from chromates and dichromates of the alkali or alkaline earth metals (ANSI Standard Z 37.7-1971) under Article VI, Section 1910.1000, Table Z-2.

**Interpretation**: Citations shall be cited as following:

a. Violations resulting from employee exposure to lead chromate under the lead standard, Article VI, Section 1910.1025.

b. Violations resulting from employee exposure to zinc chromate and dichromate as well as other chromates and dichromates under Article VI, Section 1910.1000, Table Z-2 (PEL 0.1

 $mg/m^3$ ).

**Effective Date:** This instruction is effective upon receipt and will remain in effect

until cancelled or superseded by amendment to the Rules and

Regulations.
