OSH Program Directive Number 80-1910.1000-2

Subject: Article VI, Section 1910.1000, Table Z-2, Citation Policy for Chromates and Chromic Acids.

Standard: Article VI, Section 1910.1000, Table Z-2, Rules and Regulations, Commissioner of Labor, State of South Carolina.

Cross Reference to Federal Standards: 29 CFR 1910.1000, Table Z-2.

Background: OSHA has been citing violations resulting from employee exposure to chromic acid, mist, or dust from chromates and dichromates of the alkali or alkaline earth metals (ANSI Standard Z 37.7-1971) under Article VI, Section 1910.1000, Table Z-2.

Interpretation: Citations shall be cited as following:

- a. Violations resulting from employee exposure to lead chromate under the lead standard, Article VI, Section 1910.1025.
- b. Violations resulting from employee exposure to zinc chromate and dichromate as well as other chromates and dichromates under Article VI, Section 1910.1000, Table Z-2 (PEL 0.1 mg/m³).

Effective Date: This instruction is effective upon receipt and will remain in effect until cancelled or superseded by amendment to the Rules and Regulations.
