OSH Program Directive Number: 80-1910.142-1 (Revised)

Subject: Citing for Temporary Housing For Agricultural Workers Meeting
ETA Standards As Related to Article VI, Section 1910.142.

Standard: Article VI, Section 1910.142, Rules and Regulations,
Commissioner of Labor, State of South Carolina; and U.S.
Department of Labor's ETA Standard 20 CFR part 654.

Background: On March 4, 1980, the Employment Training Administration
(ETA) had published in the Federal Register a document to
renumber and transfer Eta housing standards from 20 CFR 620 to
Subpart E of Part 654. In addition, the U.S. Department of Labor is
amending its rules to allow for the continued application of the
ETA standards with respect to housing which was built in reliance
on these standards. This directive replaces OSH Program Directive
number 78-1910.142-1 dated April 28, 1978.

Interpretation: To be consistent with federal policy, the South Carolina Division
of Occupational Safety and Health will adhere to the following
policy:

- (a) Any temporary housing built prior to April 1, 1980, meeting ETA standards set
forth in Subpart E of 20 CFR 654, will continue to be accepted by the Division of
Occupational Safety and Health as in compliance iwht the OSHA temporary labor
camp standards. Thus, any discrepancies which exist between the ETA and
OSHA standards will be cited as de minimis.

- (b) All temporary housing construction undertaken on or after April 1, 1980, shall
meet all OSHA standards under Article VI, Section 1910.142.

Effective Date: This instruction is effective upon receipt and will remain in effect
until cancelled or superseded by amendment to the Rules and
Regulations.
