Background: The purpose of this directive is to clarify the types of dust covered

under the "inert or nuisance dust" permissible exposure limits in

Table Z-3 of Section 1910.1000.

The title, Mineral Dusts, on Table Z-3 has created confusion as to whether organic nuisance dusts, such as soybean dust, fall under the "inert or nuisance dust" permissible exposure limits found in this table. The matter was taken under review by federal OSHA officials, and they decided that this title is noncontrolling. This is because the Threshold Limit Valves (TLV) Committee of the American Conference of Governmental Industrial Hygienists (ACGIH) does not restrict nuisance dusts to the mineral type. (See Appendix E of ACGIH's annual publication of TLV's and see

Documentation for TLV's by ACGIH.)

Interpretation:

- a. The "inert or nuisance dust" permissible exposure limits in Table Z-3 of Article VI, Section 1910.1000 shall be applied to all types of nuisance dusts, both organic and mineral.
- b. The issuance of such citations shall be accomplished by the Division of Occupational Health, DHEC, after careful documentation.

Effective Date: This instruction is effective upon receipt and will remain in effect

until cancelled or superseded by amendment to the Rules and

Regulations.
